


## Demographic Breakdown

The racial and ethnic makeup of Beverly consists of 84.6% of the population that identifies as non Hispanic white, 6.3% as Hispanic/Latino, 4.0% as two or more races, 2.2% as Asian, 2.1% as Black or African American, 0.68% as other, 0.06% as American Indian, and 0.02% as Pacific Islander.


#### Beverly Population by Age




Age Range

#### Beverly Population Language Spoken at Home



### Social and Economic Breakdown


