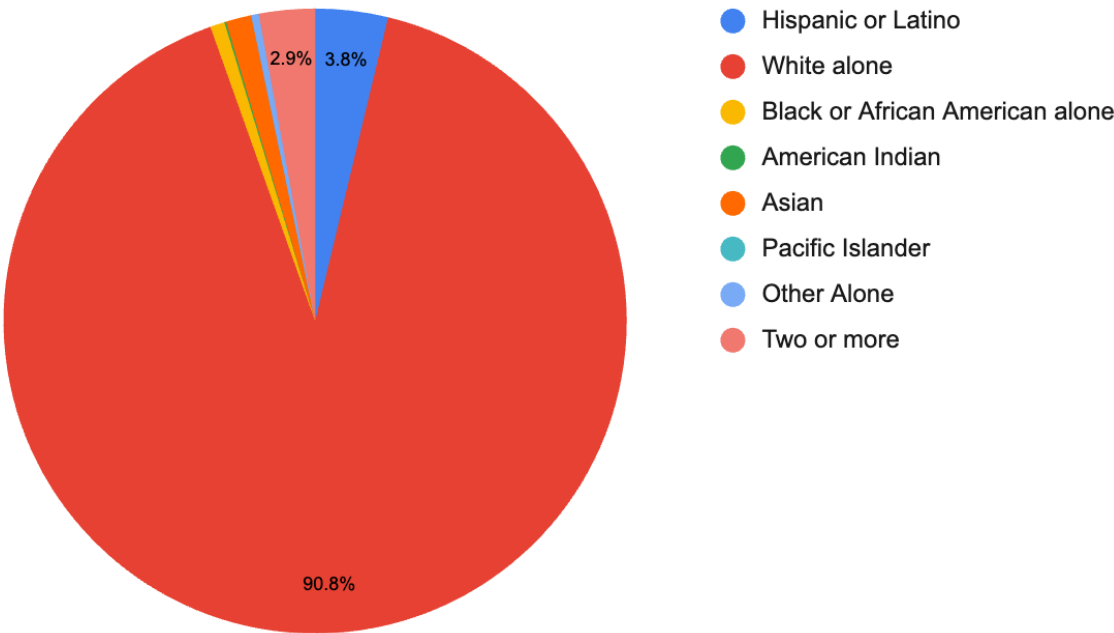

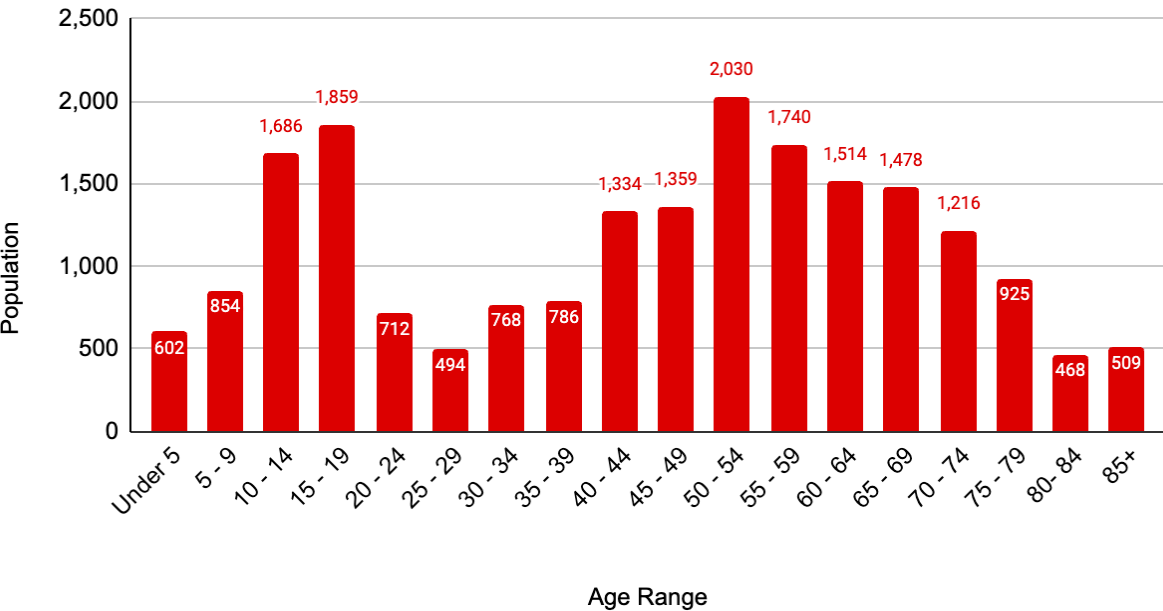
Demographics include race and ethnicity, age, sex, and language spoken. Understanding these characteristics allows us to better serve our communities.

Marblehead by Race



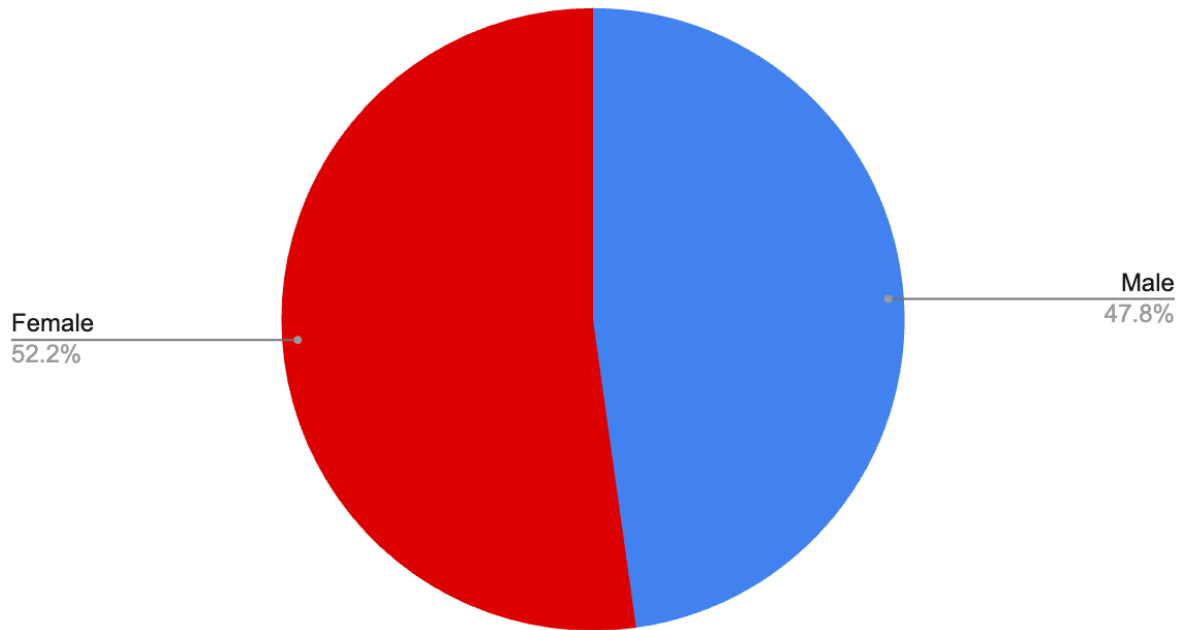
The racial and ethnic makeup of Marblehead consists of 90.8% of the population that identifies as non Hispanic white,3.8% as Hispanic/Latino, 2.9% as two or more races, 1.33% as Asian, 0.76% as Black or African American, 0.39% as other, 0.09% as American Indian, and 0% as Pacific Islander.

Marblehead Population by Age

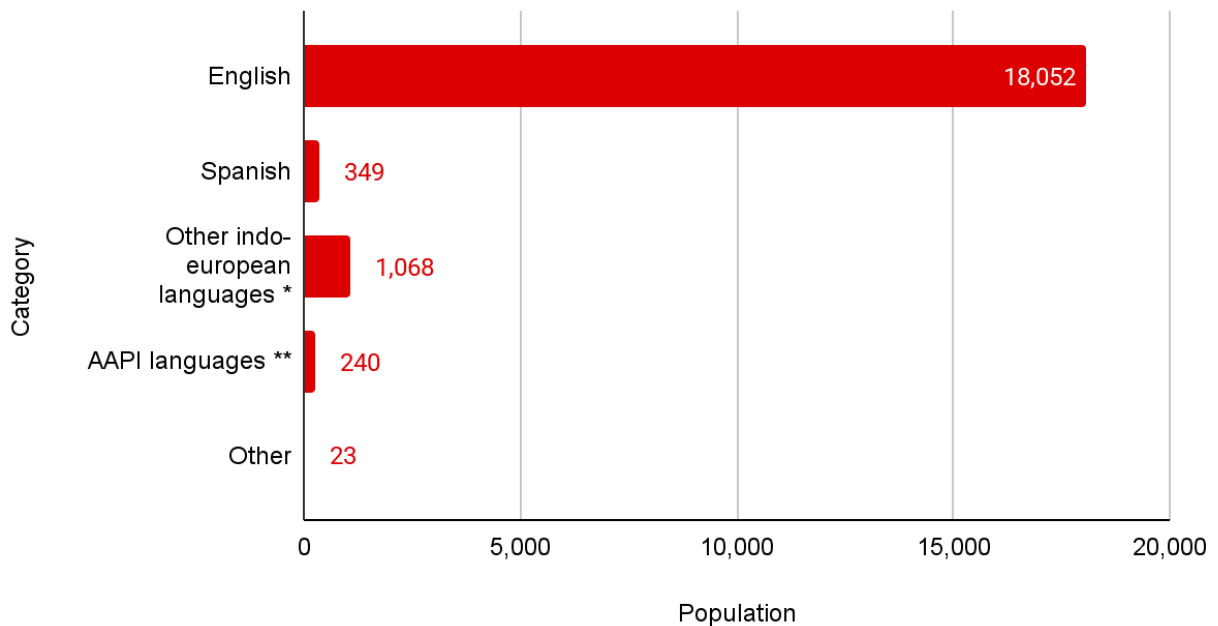


The Median age of a Marblehead resident is 49.1 and the largest sections of the population fall between 50-54 with 2,030 people and 15-19 with 1,859 people.

Marblehead Population Language Spoken at Home



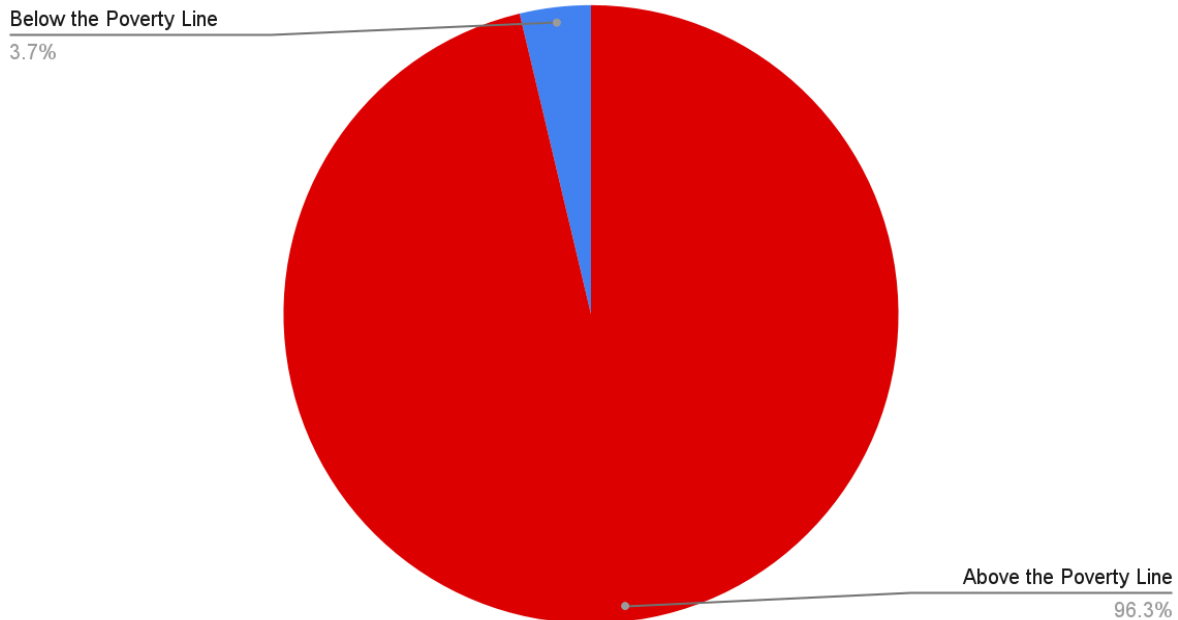

Social and Economic Breakdown

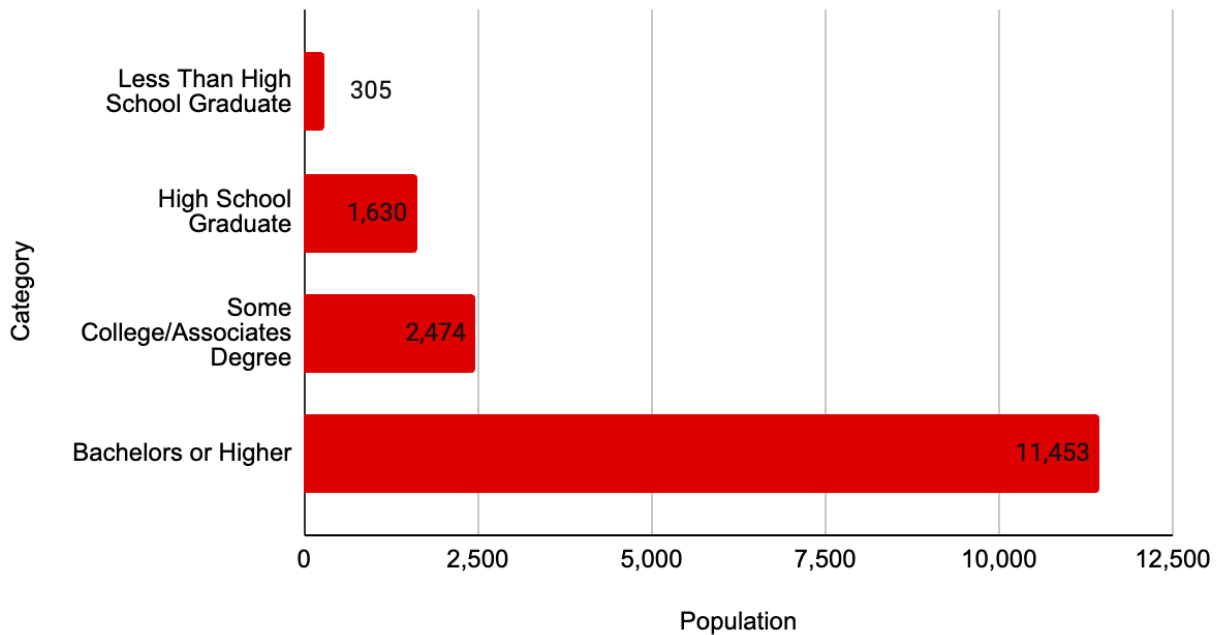

3.7% of Marblehead residents fall at or below the poverty line which is much lower than the state's average of 10.4%.

Marblehead Population by Education Status



4,409 Marblehead residents above the age of 18 do not have a college degree while 11,453 have received a bachelor's degree or a higher level of education.
