



## Demographic Breakdown


Demographics include race and ethnicity, age, sex, and language spoken. Understanding these characteristics will allow us to better serve our communities.






The racial and ethnic makeup of Peabody consists of 77.3% of the population that identifies as non Hispanic white,9.9% as Hispanic/Latino, 5.0% as two or more races, 2.4% as Asian, 3.3% as Black or African American, 1.94% as other, 0.10% as American Indian, and 0.01% as Pacific Islander.

#### Peabody Population by Age




The median age of a Peabody resident is 46.6 and the largest sections of the population fall between 55-59 with 4,280 people and 30-34 with 3,826 people. The age distribution in Peabody follows closely to a normal distribution.

### Peabody Population Language Spoken at Home




## Social and Economic Breakdown
