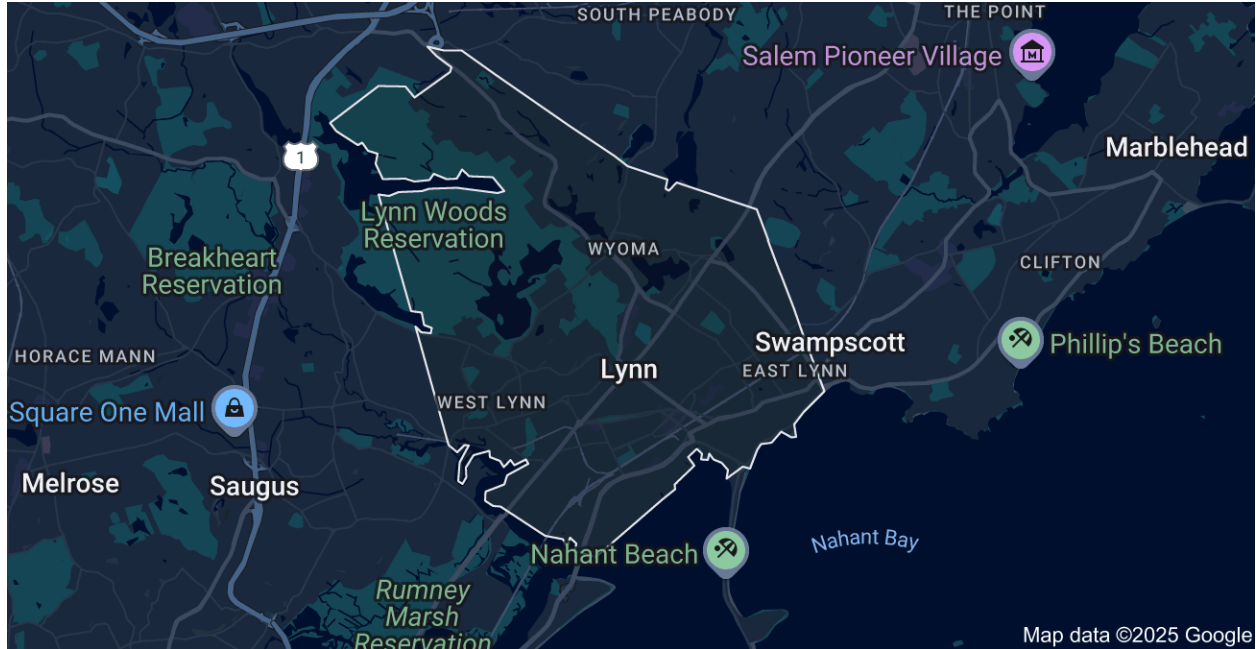

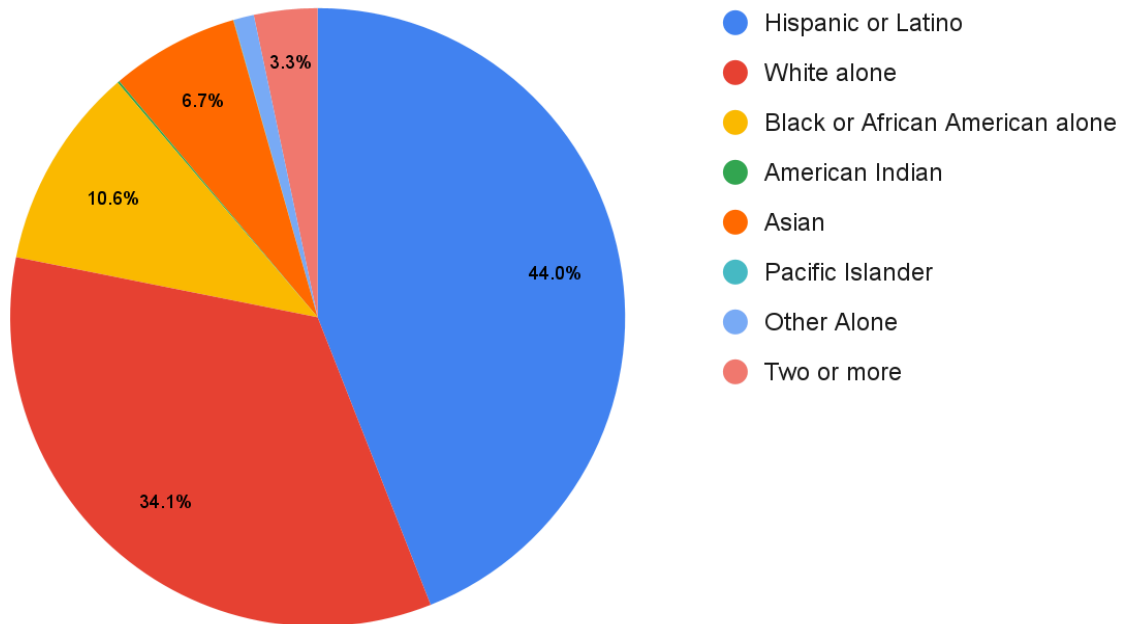

## Demographic Breakdown

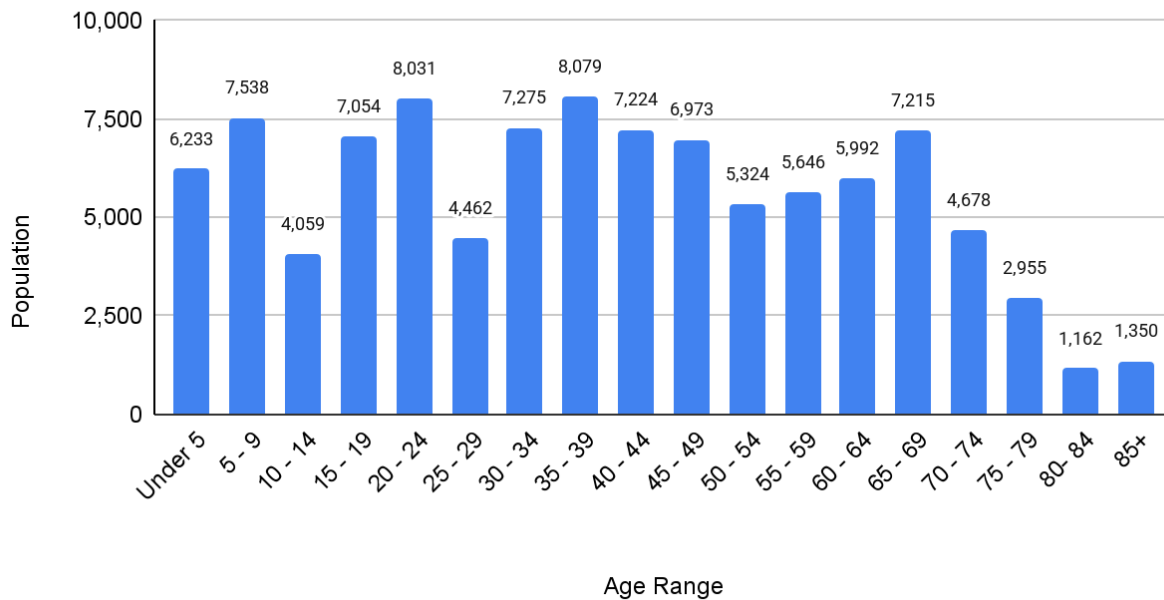
Demographics include race and ethnicity, age, sex, and language spoken. Understanding these characteristics will allow us to better serve our communities.

## Lynn by Race



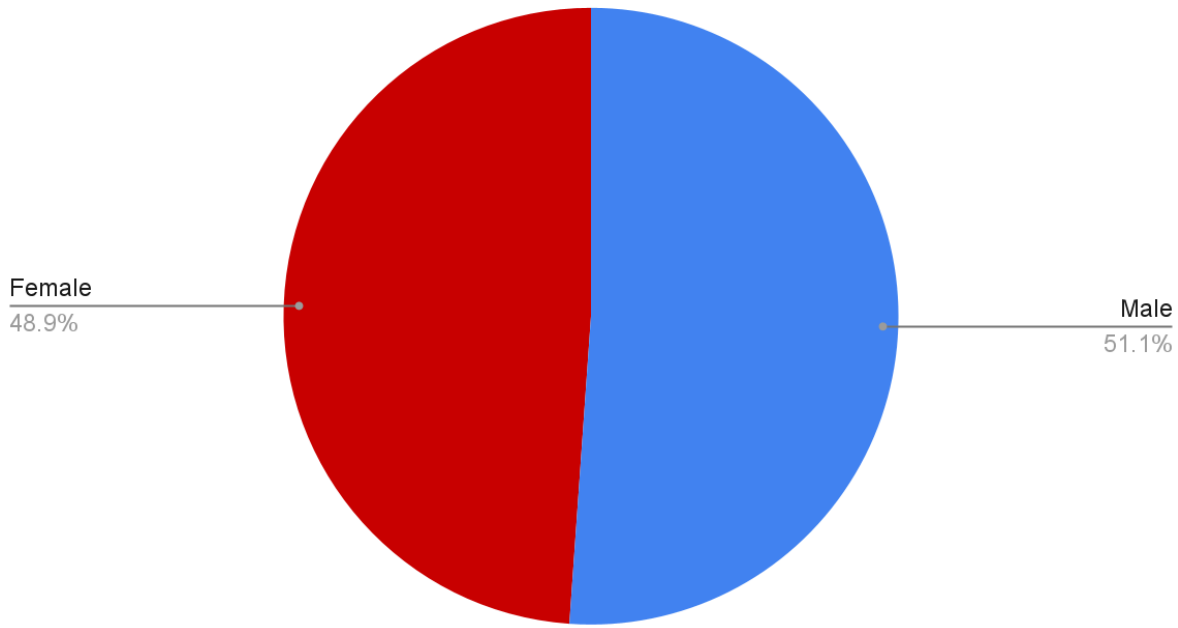
The racial and ethnic makeup of Lynn consists of 34.1% of the population that identifies as non Hispanic white, 44% as Hispanic/Latino, 3.3% as two or more races, 6.7% as Asian, 10.6% as Black or African American, 1.06% as other, 0.11% as American Indian, and 0.03% as Pacific Islander.

## Lynn Population by Age

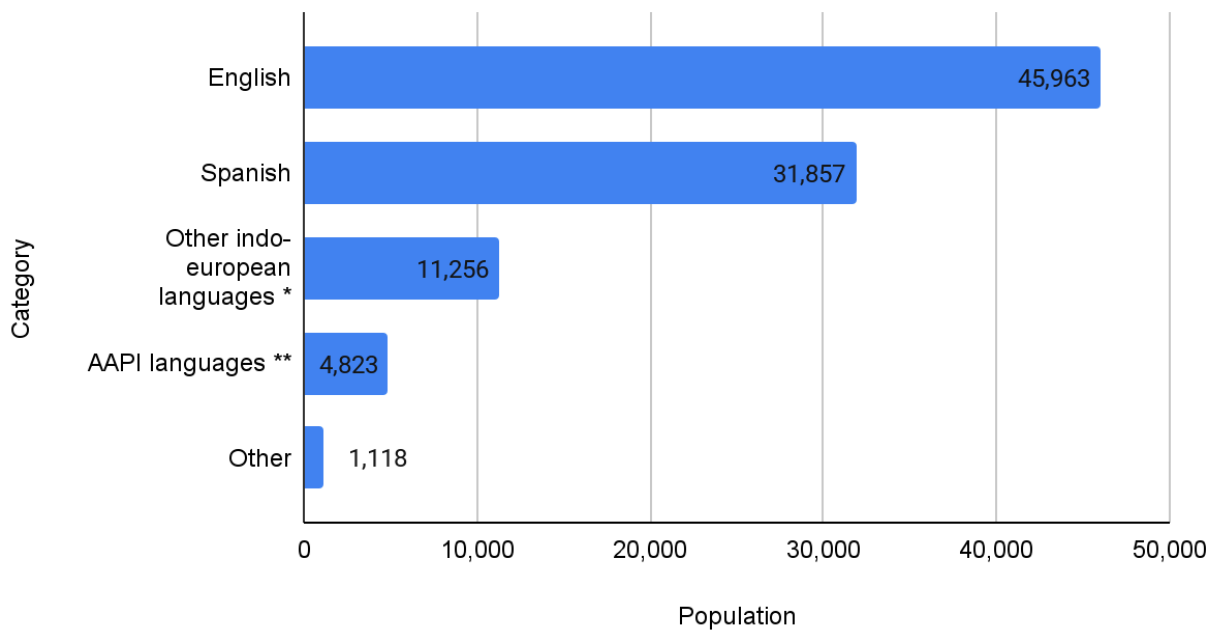


The median age of a Lynn resident is 38.7 and the largest sections of the population fall between 20-24 with 8,031 and 5-9 with 7,538 people. The age distribution in Lynn follows closely to a normal distribution.

### Lynn Population Language Spoken at Home



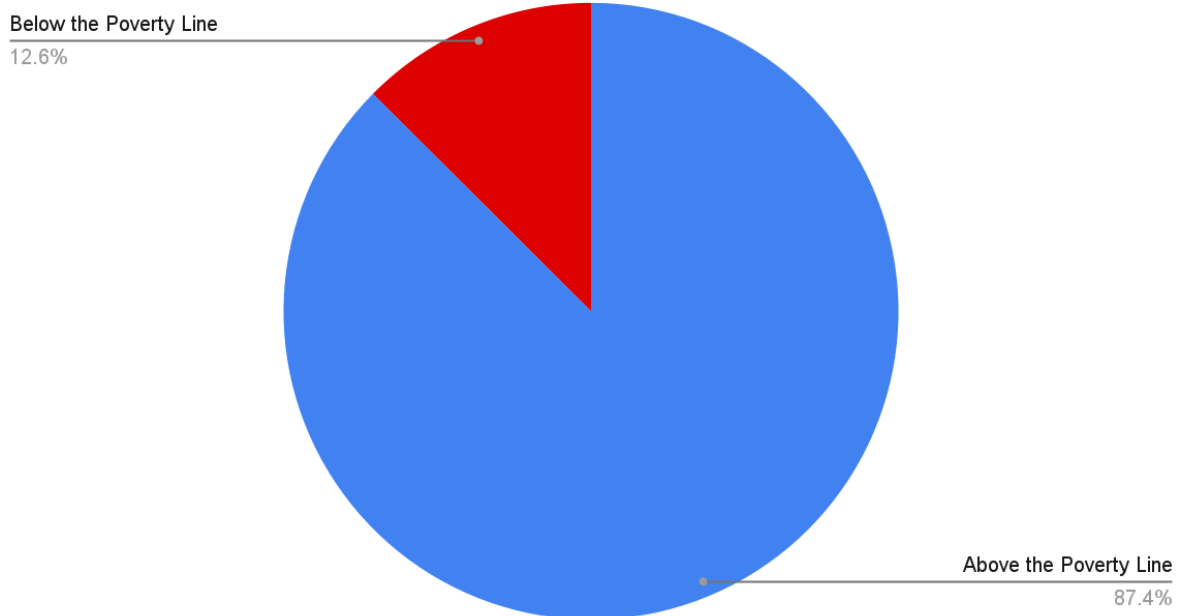

## Social and Economic Breakdown

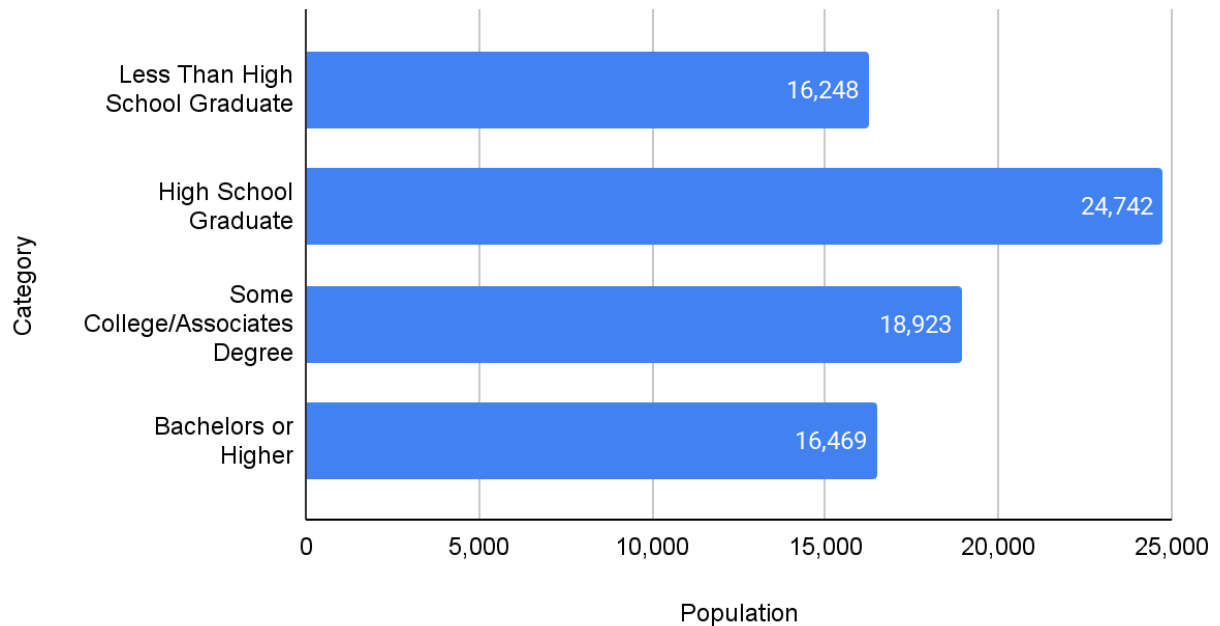

### Lynn by Poverty Status



12.6% of Lynn residents live at or below the poverty line. This number is higher than the state's average of 10.4%.

## Lynn Population by Education Status



59,913 Lynn residents above the age of 18 do not have a college degree while 16,469 have received a bachelor's degree or a higher level of education.
