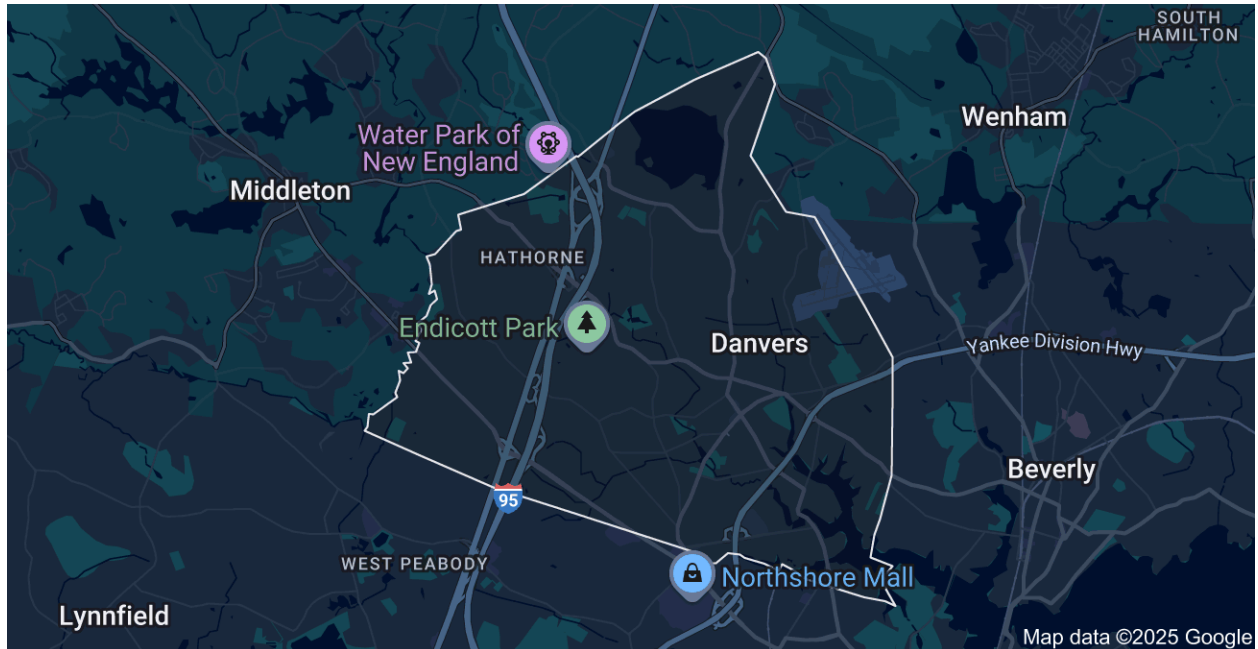

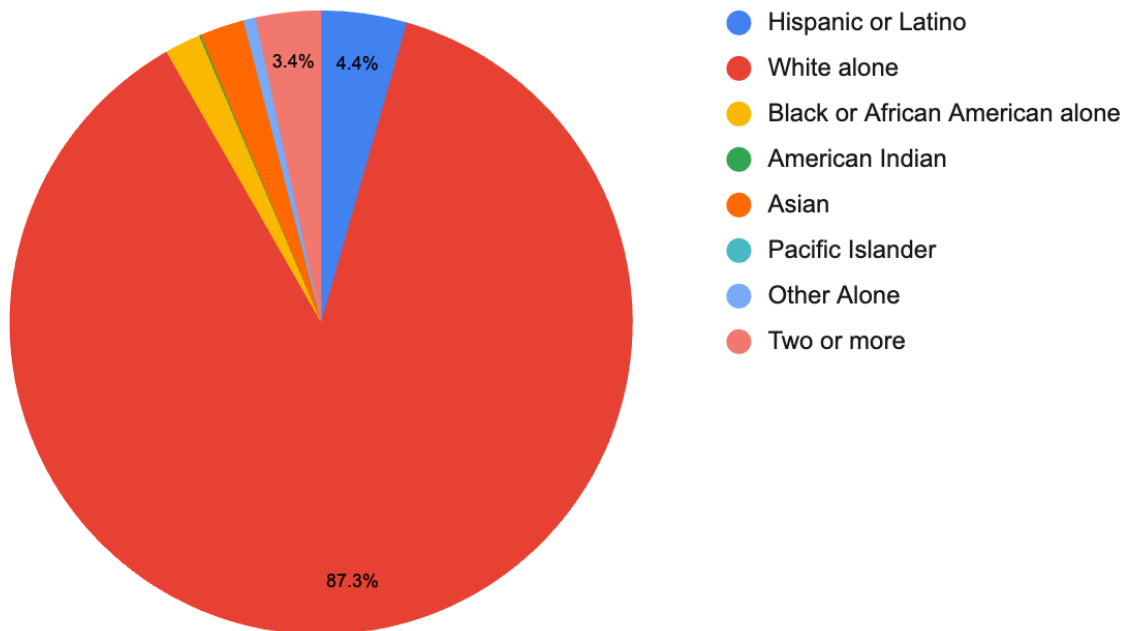

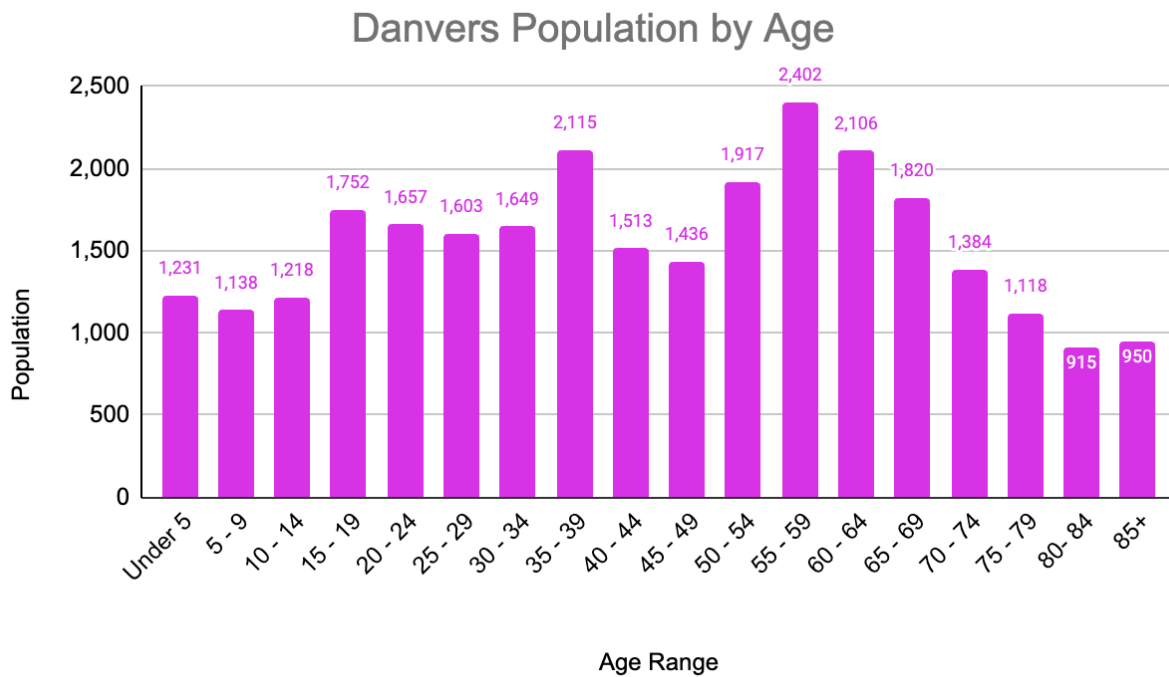
Demographic Breakdown

Danvers by Race

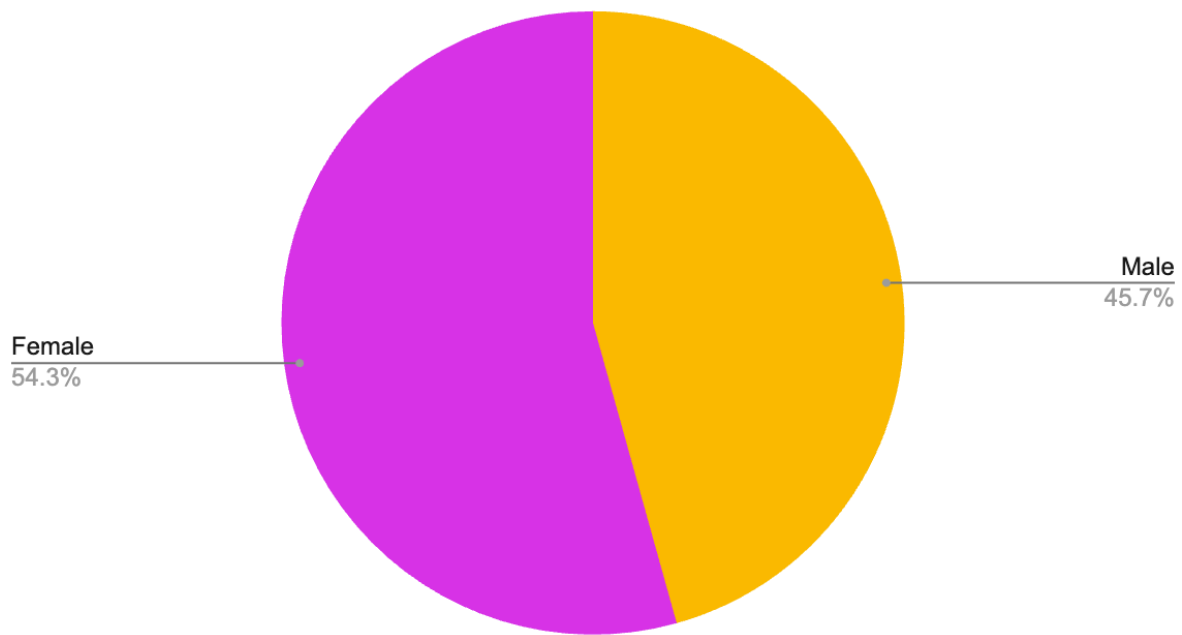


The racial and ethnic makeup of Danvers consists of 87.3% of the population that identifies as non Hispanic white, 4.4% as Hispanic/Latino, 3.4% as two or more races, 2.33% as Asian, 1.88% as Black or African American, 0.63% as other, and 0.08% as American Indian.

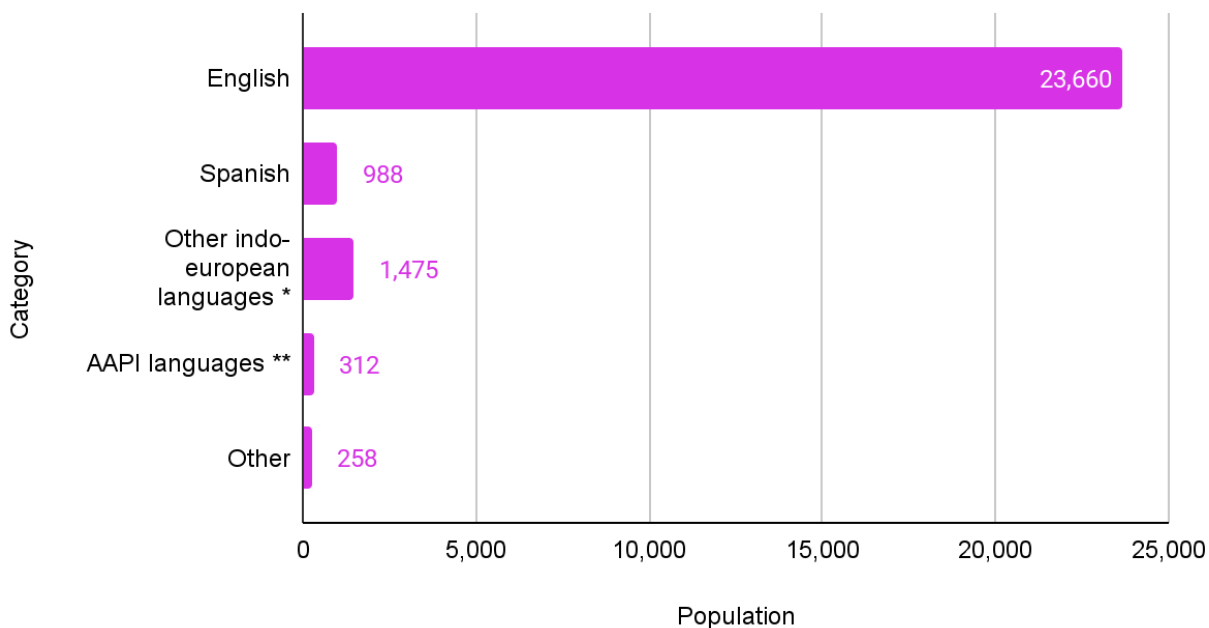


The Median age of a Danvers resident is 45.5 and the largest sections of the population fall between 55-59 with 2,402 and 35-39 with 2,115 people. The age distribution in Danvers follows closely to a normal distribution.

Danvers Population Language Spoken at Home



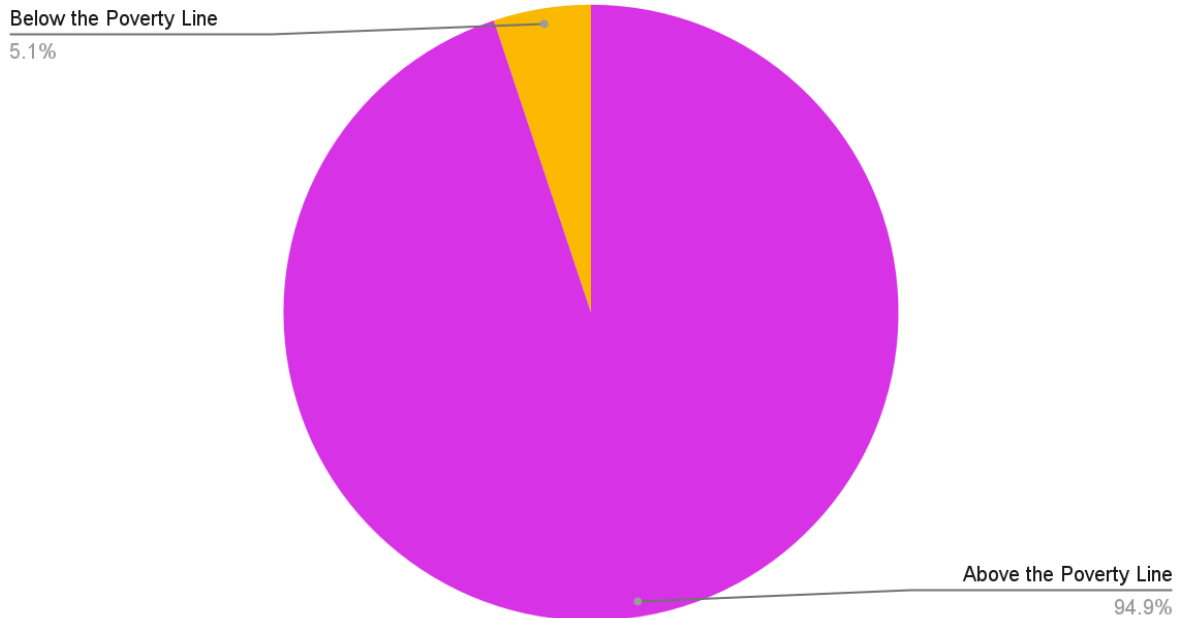

Social and Economic Breakdown

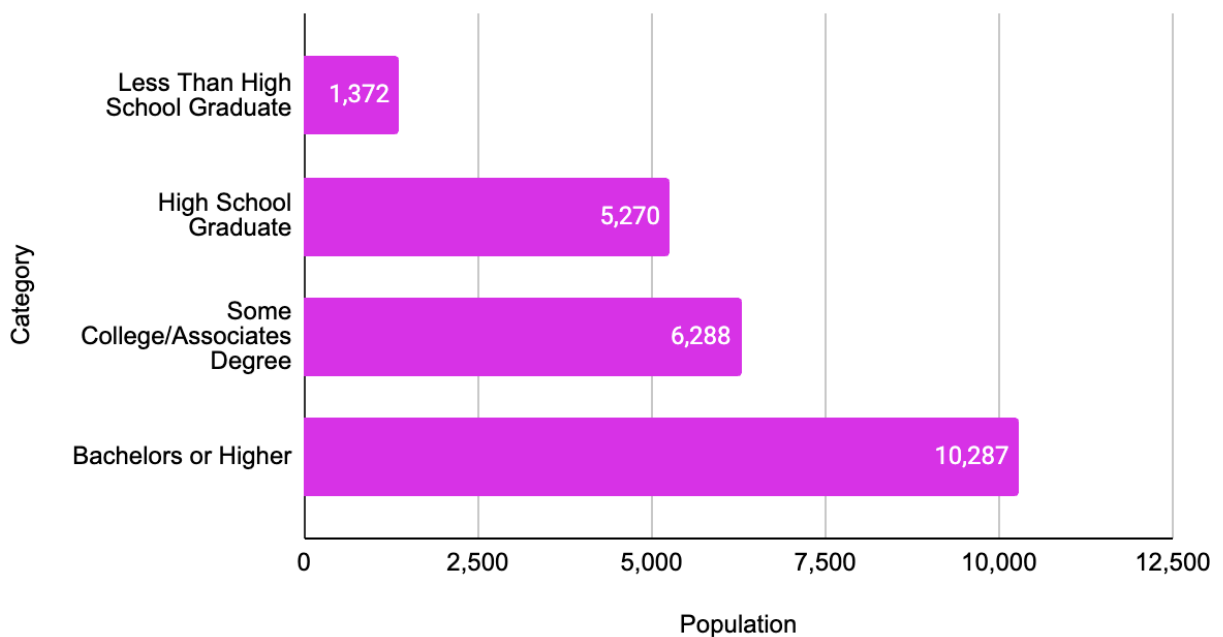

Danvers by Poverty Status



5.1% of Danvers residents live at or below the poverty line. This is lower than the state's average, which is 10.4%.

Danvers Population by Education Status



12,930 Danvers residents above the age of 18 do not have a college degree while 10,287 have received a bachelor's degree or a higher level of education.
